1. CDTA Dance Jam - Sunday Oct 1st, Regina at Queensbury Centre. Classes are offered in Ballet, Tap, Jazz, Lyrical and Hip Hop -for students age 7+ Rate \$55, \$65, \$75 depending on level. Early Regist. by Sep 15
2. Groove Street Dance Convention - October 28 & 29, Saskatoon at TCU Place. Classes offered in Hip Hop, Tap, Jazz, Lyrical (No Ballet) Register by Sept 15 Jr. \$200, Int/Sr. \$220 -includes a free t-shirt. Register from Sep 20-Oct 8 -Jr \$220. Int/Sr \$240. After Oct 8 - registration accepted if space is available Jr. \$240, Int/Sr \$260.
3. Triple Threat Dance Convention - November 18 & 19, Saskatoon at Prairieland Exhibition Park. Classes are offered in Hip Hop, Tap, Jazz, Lyrical (No Ballet Classes). Early Registration by Oct 25

Dance Attire is part of the discipline of dance class. A neat and tidy appearance sets an attitude of attentiveness and respect for students, teacher and the art of dance. In order to teach effectively, see proper body alignments, and make necessary corrections, the dancer must be dressed properly.

Our dress code is listed on the website and will be strictly enforced this season - if a student comes to class without the proper attire, they may not be able to participate and may be asked to sit and observe.

*Hair **MUST** be secured and fixed away from the face. A dancer can work better and learn easier with hair out of the eyes - especially when working on turns. It is also not a distraction.*
